 Admission to the minor is competitive. Neither completion of the prerequisites nor attainment of any specific GPA guarantees
 admission. The Embedded Systems minor is not available to Electrical Engineering majors.
- Minor Prerequisite courses: MATH 124, MATH 125, MATH204, PHYS 161, PHYS 162, and CSCI 140 or CSCI 141. Students must obtain at least a C- in the above courses and an overall GPA in them of 2.0 or higher to be considered. AP scores are converted to GPA as follows: 5 = A; 4 = B; 3 = C. Decisions are based primarily on cumulative GPA in the prerequisite courses, but successful completion of other required Minor courses, GPA in a Major, and overall GPA are also considerations.
- Only complete applications will be given consideration. Late applications will not be accepted.
